"Nuts!" Night
December 16, 2013



Join us on Monday evening, December 16, for a gala, black-tie dinner dance at the Renaissance Hotel in Brussels. An evening to remember and to enjoy thoroughly! A portion of the proceeds from the dinner will go to the Community Help Service and other organizations that help the international community and contribute to Belgo-American friendship.

Nearly 70 years ago, in the final months of WWII, Hitler threw his last resources into a major offensive on the Western Front. On December 16, 1944, up to 25 Wehrmacht divisions attacked along a narrow front in the Ardennes region in Belgium. For several days the battle raged on with heavy losses on both sides. This episode of the war has become known as the Battle of the Bulge.

One of the most remembered events of this battle has been US General McAuliffe's refusal to surrender to Nazi forces that had encircled his 101 Airborne division in Bastogne. His statement "Nuts!" has become a symbol of American resilience in the face of overwhelming odds.

On December 16 of this year, the American Club of Brussels is organizing the first "Nuts!" night in Brussels in a spirit of reconciliation with our German friends and in recognition of Belgo-American friendship. The evening will bring together many members of the American community in Belgium as well as a large number of representatives of the locally-based international and Belgian business world.

The evening's festivities will begin with an aperitif, followed by a three-course dinner. After dinner, there will be a cash bar and live music so you can dance the night away. And, to add to the entertainment, there will be a silent auction!

A Guided Visit to the Henry van de Velde Exhibition



Van de Velde (1863-1957) was trained as painter, but developed further as an architect, interior designer, designer, teacher and artistic adviser. He left an impressive oeuvre and built up an international career, boasting a great number of creations in Belgium, Germany, The Netherlands and France. Among his best-known buildings are the villa Bloemenwerf in Uccle, various Art Nouveau residences in Weimar, the Kröller-Müller Museum in Otterlo and the modernist Boekentoren of the University of Ghent. He was one of the originators of the school of art that gave rise to the Bauhaus and founded the La Cambre School of art in Brussels. In his furniture, silverware, porcelain, jewelry, book bindings and other creations, he proved able, as no other, to combine practical utility with elegant sturdiness, thereby gaining international renown.

To celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Henry van de Velde, the exhibition *Henry van de Velde – Passion - Function - Beauty* will be a chronological survey of the life and work of this multi-faceted artist, based on a never previously seen assembly of works of art and a multitude of documents, including photographs and letters. It is being set up by the Royal Museums of Art and History in co-operation with the Klassik Stiftung Weimar. Numerous other activities to do with Van de Velde and organized by other bodies will be taking place under the umbrella of this retrospective.


Thanksgiving Dinner

A Guided Visit to the Rogier van der Weyden Exhibition



Join us on Sunday, December 1st for a guided visit of the fabulous exhibit, The Heritage of Rogier van der Weyden: Painting in Brussels 1450-1520.

The exhibition at the Royal Museum for Fine Arts is devoted to painting in Brussels in the period between the death of Rogier van der Weyden (1464) and the activity of Bernard van Orley (1515-1541).

At that moment, Brussels was a thriving town, the Coudenberg Palace being the favorite residence of the dukes of Burgundy. It was surrounded by the palaces of courtiers and noble families like the Nassaus or the Ravensteins. They were all important patrons of the arts.

Building on the results of recent research and existing studies, the exhibition presents an overall picture of painting in Brussels in the late 15th and first years of the 16th centuries, tackling the subject from various viewpoints: historical, iconographic, stylistic, technical, economic and in terms of work organization and exact copying.



Introducing – Virtual Reality Medical Institute (VRMI)



We are pleased to introduce to you this month the ninth corporate member to be profiled in News & Events. Dr. Wiederhold often attends ACB events and would be pleased to chat with you about this exciting new technology.



Virtual Reality Medical Institute (VRMI) is a Belgian corporation located on the Université Catholique de Louvain's Woluwe Saint Lambert campus. Chosen as one of the first occupants of the Brussels Life Science Incubator (BLSI) for advanced technology and healthcare start-ups, VRMI was also one of the Belgian SME's who participated in the June 2013 Belgian Economic Mission to California, led by Prince Philippe, now King Philippe, of Belgium.

In 2013 VRMI established a private behavioral healthcare clinic in Brussels to serve the needs of the expat community. Specializing in stress management, treatment of psychophysiological disorders (headache, pain), phobias, panic, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), the clinic uses virtual reality (VR) and three-dimensional computer simulations in combination with physiological monitoring and feedback. President Brenda Wiederhold received her doctorate in Psychology in California, is licensed in both Belgium and California, and holds international certifications in biofeedback and neurofeedback.

Using a Combined Communications Platform of an annual international conference, specialized workshops, clinician training courses, a peer-reviewed scientific journal, a quarterly magazine, and a website information portal, VRMI is also active in informing and educating the general public, policymakers, funding agents, industry and academia. Having been involved in R&D projects in Europe, Asia, and the U.S. for the past 25 years, the principals of VRMI are now actively involved in bringing over 30 developed products and protocols to market. VRMI is currently seeking a distribution channel partner, angel investment, or venture capital to help realize this goal.

VRMI has established affiliates in both China and the U.S. and envisages the goals of the EU in developing the healthcare of the future. VRMI has expertise in simulation technologies in three main areas: 1) treating patients with stress, anxiety, trauma, and chronic pain; 2) training for military medical and civilian first responder populations, and 3) enhancing medical educational programs. Working closely with the Belgian Erasmus Program, VRMI also serves as a mentor to Young Entrepreneurs.
