Once again, the ACB offers members and guests a unique opportunity to view the [Ommegang procession](#) on the Grand'Place while dining in one of the most elegant restaurants in Brussels.

[La Maison du Cygne](#) is housed in a former 17th century guild house that overlooks the Grand'Place. From the balcony and windows of a large private dining room, we will have an unparalleled view of the Ommegang as the pageant unfolds on one of the most beautiful squares in the world.

The Ommegang takes place each year on the first Thursday in July and the preceding Tuesday (this year, Tuesday, July 5 and Thursday, July 7). Ommegang (literally “walk-around”) is a faithful recreation of a splendid pageant that was first performed in 1549 for Emperor Charles V, his son Philip II, and the knights of the Order of the Golden Fleece.

Staged at night on the illuminated Grand'Place, the two-hour extravaganza includes flag-throwers, folk dancers, archers,

acrobats, jesters, jugglers, fire-eaters, falcon-trainers, folkloric giants, stilt-walkers, and the famous Gilles of Binche. Descendants of the nobility of the time play the roles and wear the coats of arms and sumptuous costumes of their ancestors.

This is a spectacular affair, and one of the biggest festivals in the country. Our dinner evening at La Maison du Cygne offers, literally and figuratively, a window on this amazing event. Bring your camera.

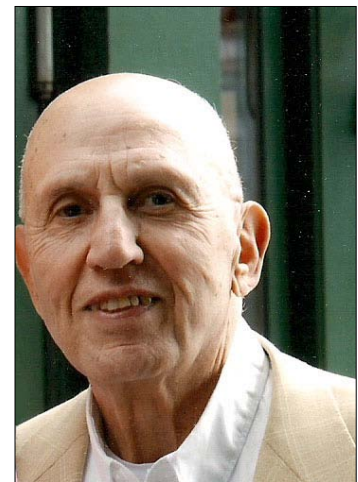

Farewell to Armen Chertavian, ACB Member Since 1974

Capt. Armen Chertavian, U.S. Navy Retired, died on March 23, 2011. A resident of Brussels, he was 83 years old.

He was predeceased by his wife of 41 years, Janet Dancause Chertavian.

He is survived by his son, Vahan Chertavian of Hawi, Hawaii, his daughter-in-law, Linda, and grandchildren, Aniela and Diran. He is also survived by his sister, Lucia Yapp, and brothers, Diran and Levon Chertavian; and his loving companion of 10 years, Leyla Pinter.



“Chet” was born in Lowell, Massachusetts, on August 13, 1928. He was the son of Kevork and Elizabeth Chertavian. Chet was a graduate of Lowell High School. After high school, he attended the U.S. Naval Academy and was a member of the class of 1951. His naval career spanned 23 years. The highlights of those years were command of two ships. After retiring from the Navy while stationed in Germany, his family moved to Brussels.

After working for an international construction company for a few years, Chet established an import-export company, ArJan. He was involved with home and auto security, and the brand name of “Mr. Security” became his moniker. The company was responsible for introducing many innovative security products in Europe.

Chet was a mentor. A great listener, his counsel was sought by many. There was nary a problem too big that could not be handled. With a positive, cheerful outlook on life, it was always inevitable, that a moment with Chet was one to be full of laughter and forever cherished.

His wisdom and humor will be sorely missed and his essence can be summed up with his favorite phrase, “Old too soon, smart too late.”

The AWCB is organizing a “Thousand and One Nights” trip to North India departing Brussels on Friday, October 21 and returning on Tuesday, November 1. The 12-day trip includes visits to Old and New Delhi; Udaipur, a beautiful city on the banks of Lake Pichola; Ranakpur, with its famous marble Jain temples; Jodhpur (“the blue city”) known for its formidable fort; Jaipur (the “Pink City”) in time for its famed festival of lights; Amber, the former state capital of Rajasthan; the tiger reserve at Ranthambore; Fatehpur Sikri, a deserted capital built and abandoned by the emperor mogul Akbar in the 16th century; and Agra, with its Red Fort and the Taj Mahal.

The price of €3990 per adult in a double room includes direct flights Brussels/Delhi/Brussels with Lufthansa, accommodation in 4-star hotels or resorts, full board from Day 2 to Day 11, local transport in air conditioned buses, the flight from Delhi to Udaipur, all entrance fees, two game park drives in four-wheel drive vehicles, First Class air conditioned train from Ranthambore to Bharatpur, and the services of a professional English-speaking guide.
