Guided Visit to the Villa Empain

The ACB has planned a very special visit to the Villa Empain, one of the most beautiful Art Deco jewels in Brussels. Commissioned in 1930 by the 21-year old Baron Louis Empain as his private residence, and built by the Swiss architect Michel Polak, the villa has had a colorful history. In 1937, the baron donated it to the Belgian State with the intention of creating a museum of decorative and contemporary art. Unfortunately, it was requisitioned during World War II by the Germans, and then by the Allies. It later served as the Soviet embassy, and even as a home to the Belgian TV station RTL.



After languishing in disrepair for a number of years, the 55-acre property was acquired by the Boghossian Foundation in 2007. In the same year it was classified by the Brussels-Capital Region. The Boghossian Foundation has painstakingly restored the Villa Empain and grounds to their former elegance. Indeed, it recently won a European Union prize for Cultural Heritage for the quality of the restoration, as well as for its new use as a center for art and dialogue between Eastern and Western cultures.

The Boghossian Foundation recently opened this architectural gem to the public. Our guided tour will focus on this supreme example of Art Deco architecture, as well as on its history and current purpose.

For those who would like to stay on and have lunch following the tour, there is a pleasant café/restaurant in the former caretaker's lodge where we could enjoy a meal and share our impressions of the visit.

Pioneers' Dinner

The Pioneers' Club is pleased to announce that its next dinner will be held at the Château Ste.-Anne on Tuesday, October 4. Our special guest speaker will be the former American ambassador to the Czech Republic, Richard W. Graber. The subject of Ambassador Graber's talk will be "Reflections of a Former Ambassador: The Czech Republic, Central Europe and Beyond."

Ambassador Graber is currently vice president at Honeywell International in Brussels, with responsibility for government relations in Europe, the Middle East, and Africa.

Ambassador Graber served as the United States ambassador to the Czech Republic from September 2006 to January 2009. Among his many accomplishments while ambassador, he helped remove the requirement that Czech citizens must have a visa to travel to the United States. The change helped improve bilateral relations with the countries of Central Europe, and advanced inbound and outbound business initiatives. He worked extensively on judicial reform and other issues to improve the business environment in the Czech Republic. He also worked on missile defense treaties and surrounding issues.

Messages for U.S. Citizens

Closure of Federal Benefits Unit Brussels

Effective July 20, assistance for Federal Benefits/Social Security for persons living in Belgium and Luxembourg is now provided by the London Federal Benefits Unit. Federal Benefits includes Social Security, Medicare, Veterans' Affairs, Office of Personnel Management, and Railroad Retirement.

Many common questions are answered at the Frequently Asked Questions section of the London Federal Benefits Unit website http://london.usembassy.gov/cons_new/acs/fbu/index.html. This website also provides an online form to ask additional questions and to report changes, and gives other methods to contact the London Federal Benefits Unit.

Applications and documentation for Social Security numbers can be submitted at the embassy in Brussels by making an appointment at http://belgium.usembassy.gov/online_appointment_system_for_acs.html. Online appointments are required for all public services. Walk-in service is no longer possible.

You should review the London Federal Benefits Unit Social Security Numbers (SSN) section on their website to ensure you understand the documentation required for the processing of requests for assignment of Social Security numbers, verification of Social Security numbers that have already been assigned, and name changes due to marriage or divorce.

New Immigration Rule

A worrying change in U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) procedure recently came into effect that makes it more difficult for Americans to return to the U.S. with a foreign spouse and/or non-American family members.

Effective August 15, most Americans can no longer use the U.S. Consular Section in their country of residence for immigration matters. The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services now require that you petition directly with the USCIS in the United States to bring your non-U.S. dependents with you when you choose to return to live in the States.

It has always been the case that Americans living overseas returning to the U.S. could bring their non-American spouse and children with them by filing an Immigrant Petition (I-130, Petition for Alien Relative) form at either the Embassy/Consulate where they lived or at the local USCIS office, if there was one in their country of residence.

The process usually took between one and three months to get the immigrant visas (i.e., Green Card), and it was always easy to expedite, if need be. For petitions filed in the USCIS office in the U.S., the process often takes one to three years or more.

If you are not living in a country that has a USCIS office in its embassy – and most countries, including Belgium, do not – you will have to send your petitions to the U.S., and your petition will be treated the same as if you live in the U.S., instead of overseas.

Because of this rule, U.S. visitor visas will be difficult to get – consular officers will suspect that overseas married couples will use visitor visas to immigrate to get around the one- to two-year wait.
